Injection

Atropine Sulphate I.P 0.6mg/ml.



Rapid Sympatholytic Action

Effectively reduces vagal tone and controls bradycardia.



Reduces Secretions

Minimizes salivary, tracheobronchial and gastric secretions.



Cardiac Safety

Protects against vagally mediated bradycardia and asystole.



Fast Onset

Quick onset of action for emergent situations.



Wide Clinical Utility

Essential in anesthesia, resuscitation and critical care.
