Composition:

Each ml contains:

- Ciprofloxacin Hydrochloride IP 0.3% w/v
- Dexamethasone Sodium Phosphate IP 0.1% w/v
- · Excipients q.s.

Description:

Ciproplit D Eye/Ear Drops is a combination formulation that combines a broad-spectrum antibiotic with a corticosteroid. Ciprofloxacin acts against a wide range of Gram-positive and Gram-negative bacteria, while dexamethasone provides anti-inflammatory action. This combination is used for treating bacterial infections of the eye and ear associated with inflammation, pain, and swelling.

Pharmacology & Mechanism of Action:

- Ciprofloxacin: Inhibits bacterial DNA gyrase and topoisomerase IV, preventing bacterial DNA replication and transcription, leading to bacterial cell death.
- Dexamethasone: Suppresses inflammation by inhibiting the release of pro-inflammatory mediators and reducing capillary permeability.

Indications:

- · Bacterial conjunctivitis and keratitis
- External eye infections with inflammatory components
- · Otitis externa with bacterial infection and inflammation
- · Post-operative ocular inflammation where infection risk exists

Dosage & Administration:

- Eyes: Instill 1-2 drops into the affected eye(s) 3-4 times daily or as directed by a physician
- Ears: Instill 3-4 drops into the affected ear(s) 2-3 times daily
- · Wash hands before and after use, avoid contamination of the dropper tip
- · Duration of therapy should be as prescribed; do not stop prematurely

Contraindications:

- Hypersensitivity to ciprofloxacin, dexamethasone, or any excipients
- Viral infections of the eye (e.g., herpes simplex)
- Fungal eye infections

Warnings & Precautions:

- · Use with caution in patients with glaucoma or increased intraocular pressure
- Avoid prolonged use to prevent secondary infections or corticosteroid-induced complications
- · Do not use in the presence of corneal perforation

Drug Interactions:

- Concurrent use with other topical ophthalmic medications should be done under physician supervision
- · No significant systemic interactions expected due to minimal systemic absorption

Adverse Effects:
