Information for the Use

Clindamycin Phosphate I.P. 1% w/w + Adapalene I.P. 0.1% w/w Cream

Reduces redness, swelling, and the number of pimples, promoting clearer skin.

Composition:

Each gram of cream contains:

- Clindamycin Phosphate I.P. equivalent to Clindamycin: 1% w/w
- Adapalene I.P.: 0.1% w/w

Description:

This combination cream combines Clindamycin, a topical antibiotic, and Adapalene, a retinoid. The formulation is specifically designed to treat acne vulgaris.

- Clindamycin: Inhibits bacterial protein synthesis, effectively targeting acne-causing bacteria (*Propionibacterium acnes*) and reducing inflammation.
- Adapalene: A retinoid that normalizes keratinization, prevents clogged pores, and promotes cell turnover, reducing the formation of new acne lesions.

Indications:

 Treatment of acne vulgaris, including inflammatory lesions (papules, pustules) and noninflammatory lesions (blackheads, whiteheads).

Dosage and Administration:

- Adults and Adolescents Above 12 Years:
 - Apply a thin layer of cream to the affected areas once daily, preferably in the evening or as directed by a healthcare professional.
- Method of Use:
 - Wash the face with a mild cleanser and pat dry before application.
 - Use clean hands to apply a small amount to the entire affected area, avoiding the eyes, lips, and mucous membranes.

Contraindications:

- Hypersensitivity to Clindamycin, Adapalene, or any excipients in the formulation.
- History of antibiotic-associated colitis or severe gastrointestinal disorders.

Precautions:

 Avoid Sun Exposure: Adapalene may increase skin sensitivity to

- sunlight. Use sunscreen and protective clothing.
- Initial Irritation: Mild redness, peeling, or dryness may occur during the initial weeks of treatment.
- Pregnancy and Lactation:
 - Pregnancy: Not recommended unless prescribed by a healthcare professional.
 - Lactation: Avoid application on the chest area to prevent ingestion by infants.
- Contact with Eyes, Lips, and Mucous Membranes: Avoid contact; rinse thoroughly with water if accidental exposure occurs.

Possible Side Effects: Common side effects:

- Skin dryness, redness, or peeling
- Mild burning or stinging sensation
- Temporary skin irritation

Rare but serious side effects:

- Severe skin reactions or allergic responses
- Diarrhea or colitis caused by Clostridium difficile (though rare with topical use)

Drug Interactions:

- Other Topical Acne Treatments: Concurrent use with benzoyl peroxide, salicylic acid, or other retinoids may increase skin irritation.
- Neuromuscular Blocking Agents: Clindamycin may enhance their effects; use with caution.

Storage:

- Store below 30° C (86° F).
- Protect from direct sunlight and moisture.
- · Keep out of reach of children.

Special Instructions:

- Use the cream exactly as prescribed by your doctor.
- Do not apply more frequently than recommended; excessive use may increase irritation without improving results.
- Acne improvement may take 4–8 weeks; continue treatment as advised.
