Ebastine (10 mg) Tablet

Composition: Each tablet contains:

• Ebastine: 10 mg

Pharmacological Class:

 Antihistamine (Second-Generation H1-Receptor Antagonist)

Indications:

Ebastine is used for the relief of allergic conditions, including:

- Seasonal Allergic Rhinitis (Hay fever)
- Perennial Allergic Rhinitis
- Chronic Idiopathic Urticaria (hives)
- Other allergic conditions mediated by histamine

Mechanism of Action:

Ebastine is a selective H1-receptor antagonist that blocks histamine's effects in allergic reactions. It alleviates symptoms such as sneezing, nasal congestion, itching, and skin rashes. As a second-generation antihistamine, it has minimal sedative effects compared to firstgeneration agents.

Dosage and Administration:

- Adults and children over 12 years:
 - Allergic rhinitis: 10 mg once daily.
 - Chronic urticaria: 10 mg once daily, or as prescribed by a physician.
- Children (6–12 years): Dose adjustment may be required; consult a healthcare provider.
- Take the tablet orally with water, with or without food.

Contraindications:

- Hypersensitivity to Ebastine or any ingredients in the formulation.
- Severe liver impairment.

Warnings and Precautions:

- Hepatic Impairment: Caution is advised in patients with mild to moderate liver dysfunction.
- Cardiac Effects: In rare cases, Ebastine may prolong the QT interval; use with caution in patients with a history of arrhythmias or concurrent use of QTprolonging medications.
- Renal Impairment: Dose adjustment may be necessary for patients with severe kidney dysfunction.
- Pregnancy and Breastfeeding:
 - Pregnancy Category B: Should only be used if the potential benefit outweighs the risks.
 - Breastfeeding: Not recommended, as it is unclear if Ebastine is excreted in breast milk.

Side Effects:

Common side effects:

- Headache
- Dry mouth
- Mild drowsiness or fatigue

Rare but serious side effects:

- Allergic reactions (rash, itching, swelling)
- Dizziness or fainting (potential cardiac concerns)

Drug Interactions:

- Macrolide antibiotics (e.g., erythromycin) and azole antifungals (e.g., ketoconazole): May increase the risk of QT prolongation.
- CYP3A4 inhibitors (e.g., ritonavir): May elevate plasma levels of Ebastine.

• Alcohol: Although Ebastine has minimal sedative effects, alcohol may enhance drowsiness.

Storage:

- Store below 25°C in a dry place, away from light and moisture.
- Keep out of reach of children.

Available in blister packs containing 10 or 20 tablets.
