Composition:

Levosulpiride – 25 mg

Description:

Lesutype Tablet is a gastroprokinetic and antipsychotic medication containing Levosulpiride, a selective dopamine D2 receptor antagonist. It is primarily used to manage functional gastrointestinal disorders and certain psychiatric symptoms such as depression with somatic complaints. It improves gastric motility and relieves bloating, nausea, and reflux by enhancing GI tract peristalsis.

Indications:

Functional dyspepsia
Gastroesophageal reflux disease (GERD)
Chronic gastritis
Irritable bowel syndrome (IBS)
Negative symptoms of schizophrenia
Somatoform disorders with GI manifestations

Mechanism of Action:

Levosulpiride works by blocking presynaptic dopamine D2 receptors in the GI tract, leading to increased acetylcholine release and enhanced gut motility. Its central dopamine antagonism also helps relieve psychogenic gastrointestinal symptoms and mood disorders.

Dosage and Administration:

Adults: 25 mg to 50 mg once or twice daily before meals, or as directed by the physician.

Dosage may vary based on the condition being treated and patient response.

Side Effects:

Headache, dizziness, or mild sedation
Galactorrhea or menstrual irregularities (on prolonged use)
Extrapyramidal symptoms (rare)
Breast tenderness or gynecomastia in males (in rare cases)

Precautions:

Use cautiously in patients with epilepsy or Parkinson's disease
Not recommended in children unless specifically prescribed
Avoid during pregnancy and lactation unless advised by a physician
Long-term use may alter prolactin levels

Storage:

Store in a cool and dry place, below 25°C
Protect from direct sunlight and moisture
Keep out of reach of children
